

## **Current vs. Proposed Funding of Fire District 7**

## What's at stake

**Increased property insurance rates:** At some point we will not maintain our current rating and could lose any possible rating through Property Insurance Association of Louisiana (PIAL). A lose of rating would at a minimum double property insurance cost.

**Failure of Fire Trucks:** With an aging fleet, we have had mechanical failure of fire trucks while in response to emergency calls. This will increase if trucks are not replaced.

**Care of Patients:** With current staffing and equipment the public is at a greater risk on medical calls. We will initially have only one firefighter/EMS personnel arrive on calls with the next person at least five minutes later. For critical medical calls this could reduce the success rate.

**Saving Lives and Homes from Fire:** We are required to have two firefighters to enter a burning structure to search for trapped victims or to fight fire. With the current delay of the second due truck and person, lives and homes are at high risk. If a firefighter breaks from protocol and codes and decides to enter without a second person, they are placing their life at jeopardy. Neither option is good for anyone involved in this type of incident.

**Safety of Firefighters:** We go on many types of calls. Some of them are potentially dangerous to our firefighters. This is especially true with only one firefighter/EMS personnel arriving and managing the emergency call alone for at least five (5) minutes. We have had calls where firefighter/EMS personnel safety was compromised. There is a level of risk we accept, but FD7 employees are at a much higher risk due to staffing levels.

## What can be accomplished with additional funding

**Fire and Rescue:** We could begin rescue and fire fighting operations sooner which will increase the chances for a positive outcome including **saved lives and property**. We could have more total firefighters on calls if needed with total increased staffing. This would provide more efficient fire ground operations.

**Medical Calls:** Medical patients would have two firefighters/EMS personnel on the first arriving truck which would greatly improve survival rates and reduce chances of non-critical patients degrading to critical status. Because 72% of our emergency calls are medical in nature, **we will save more lives** from cardiac arrest, respiratory arrest and trauma with additional staffing.

Firefighter/EMS Personnel Safety: With two firefighters staffed at stations, our employees will be safer on emergency calls.

**New Fire Trucks and Equipment:** We could start a truck replacement plan to have NFPA compliant fire trucks. This will reduce repair/maintenance costs and the risk of failure in response to emergency calls. We can also purchase compliant firefighting gear, breathing apparatus and equipment.

**Community Growth:** We can strategically plan for population increase and commercial growth. We would be able to upgrade fire stations to house employees and look and locations for needed fire stations.

**PIAL Rating:** We can improve our class rating thus reducing property insurance rates. **This could offset and in some cases be a net positive to property owners** (see Millage vs. Property Insurance spreadsheet).

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
